


# Plants for shelter

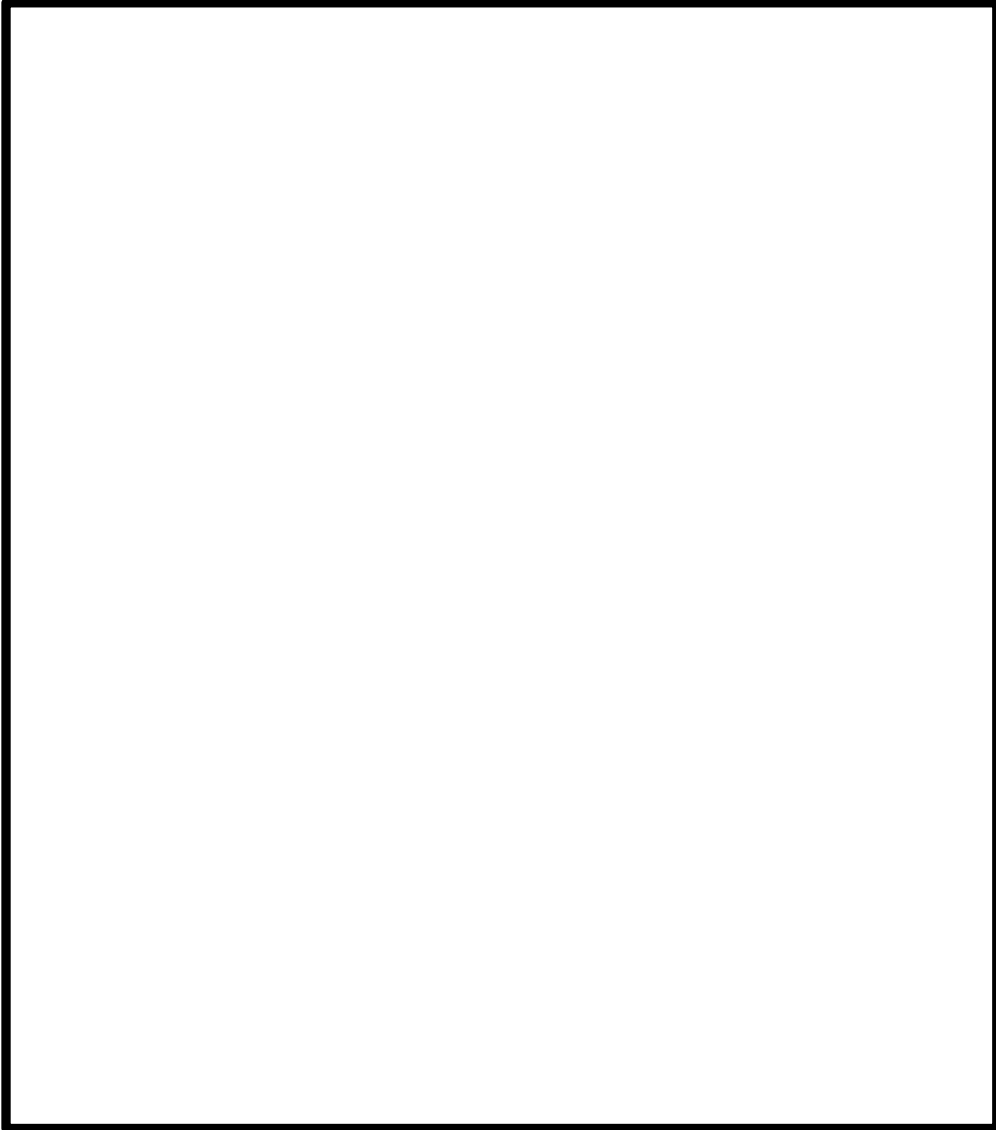
